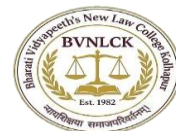

CODE OF CONDUCT FOR STUDENTS

Bharati Vidyapeeth's New Law College, Kolhapur aims to maintain a disciplined, ethical and academically vibrant environment consistent with the values of legal education, constitutional morality, and professional ethics.

The following Code of Conduct is framed in accordance with the guidelines of the Bar Council of India (BCI), University Grants Commission (UGC), NAAC, and Shivaji University regulations.



1. CODE OF CONDUCT FOR STUDENTS

1.1 General Behaviour

Students shall:

1. Maintain discipline, dignity and decorum within the college campus.
2. Show respect to teachers, staff, fellow students and visitors.
3. Uphold the values of justice, equality and rule of law as expected from law students.
4. Refrain from any behaviour that damages the reputation of the institution.
5. Follow the rules and regulations of Bharati Vidyapeeth, Shivaji University and BCI.
6. Always wear college uniform with I-card in the college premise
7. Biometric registration and attendance is mandatory

1.2 Academic Conduct

Students must:

1. Attend minimum 75% of lectures, tutorials and practicals as prescribed by BCI Rules of Legal Education.
2. Be punctual and maintain seriousness during lectures, moot courts, seminars and practical training.
3. Submit assignments, project reports and internship records within stipulated time.
4. Maintain academic integrity and avoid plagiarism, copying or unfair means in examinations.
5. Participate actively in moot courts, debates, legal aid activities, seminars and workshops.



1.3 Discipline and Campus Behaviour

Students shall:

1. Follow the dress code prescribed by the college, especially during moot courts, presentations and official events.
2. Maintain cleanliness and proper use of college property, library, classrooms and infrastructure.
3. Avoid violence, vandalism or disruptive behaviour.
4. Not bring or consume alcohol, tobacco, drugs or any prohibited substances on campus.
5. Use mobile phones responsibly in academic areas.

1.4 Respect and Equality

Students shall:

1. Maintain gender sensitivity and respect diversity.
2. Refrain from ragging, harassment or discrimination based on gender, caste, religion, language or region.
3. Follow the guidelines of Anti-Ragging Committee, Internal Complaints Committee (ICC) and Equal Opportunity Cell.

1.5 Participation in Institutional Activities

Students are encouraged to participate in:

- Moot Court Competitions
- Mock Parliament
- Legal Aid and Literacy Programs
- Sports and Cultural Activities
- Research, Seminars and Conferences



Participation helps in holistic legal education and professional development.

1.6 Digital and Social Media Conduct

Students shall:

1. Use social media responsibly.
2. Not circulate false information, defamatory content or confidential institutional information.
3. Maintain dignity and reputation of the institution and legal profession.

1.7 Consequences of Misconduct

Violation of the code may result in:

- Warning or counselling
- Suspension from activities
- Cancellation of privileges
- Disciplinary action by the College Discipline Committee

Admission Cancel/Reject

Under the admission rules of the Maharashtra State CET Cell and the Maharashtra Professional Educational Institutions Admission Rules, admission can be cancelled on the following grounds:

Sr. No.	Ground for Cancellation
1	Submission of false information in the application form or during admission.
2	Production of fake, forged, fabricated, or tampered documents/certificates.
3	Incorrect claim of category, caste, reservation, domicile, EWS, NCL, minority status, or any other eligibility criterion.
4	Failure to produce original documents for verification within the prescribed period.
5	Non-fulfilment of eligibility conditions prescribed for the LL.B. course.
6	Suppression or concealment of material facts affecting eligibility or merit.
7	Obtaining admission through impersonation or fraudulent means.
8	Failure to complete admission formalities and payment of prescribed fees within the stipulated time.
9	Admission obtained contrary to CET Cell rules, merit list, reservation policy, or CAP procedure.
10	Any discrepancy detected during scrutiny, audit, or subsequent verification by CET Cell, University, Bar Council authorities, or the institution.
11	Any other – as per the decision of College Development Committee

The admission of a student admitted through MH CET Law shall be liable to cancellation at any stage. Such cancellation may be effected even after confirmation of admission.
